## **RATES** - Funding better local infrastructure

## What will each rate option mean for you?

Council is considering three options each with different implications for service levels, asset and infrastructure renewal and long-term financial sustainability.

**OPTION 1** Rate Peg increase only (set by NSW Government) Infrastructure would further deteriorate, and service reductions would be required.
